Review Meeting of Index Testing Campaign

Date:10th May 2024

On 10th May 2024, Hon'ble Project Director Smt. K. Hymavathi, IAS, conducted a comprehensive review meeting at Telangana State AIDS Control Society (TGSACS) Headquarters, Hyderabad with the District AIDS Prevention and Control Units (DAPCUs) staff to assess the progress of the ongoing Index Testing Campaign.



The meeting, attended by Dr. P. Prasad, Additional Project Director, along with Joint Directors (JDs) and Deputy Directors (DDs), focused on evaluating the campaign's progress, addressing challenges, and formulating an action plan. In her opening remarks, Smt. Hymavathi emphasized the critical role of the Index Testing Campaign in identifying and providing care for individuals living with HIV, acknowledging the efforts of the DAPCUs staff and the importance of accurate data collection. Dr. Prasad provided an overview of the campaign's progress, highlighting the number of index cases identified and subsequent testing of their contacts. JDs and DDs presented detailed reports on their respective areas, showcasing successes and identifying challenges, including reaching hard-to-access populations and addressing stigma associated with HIV testing. Proposed solutions included enhanced community outreach, collaboration with local NGOs, and additional training for field staff. Emphasis was placed on meticulous data management and the implementation of a centralized database for real-time data entry and analysis. The meeting concluded with the development of an action plan to address challenges, improve outreach strategies, and ensure the campaign's targets are met, assigning specific tasks to DAPCUs staff with clear timelines and responsibilities to ensure accountability and effective implementation

International AIDS Candle Light Memorial Day -2024

Early Infant Diagnosis for ICTC/PPTCT Lab Technicians, TGSACS.

Date: 20-24 may 2024

From May 20 to May 24, 2024, TGSACS (Telangana State AIDS Control Society) conducted a specialized training program on Early Infant Diagnosis (EID) for ICTC/PPTCT lab technicians at RCUES, Osmania University. The objective of the training was to enhance the skills and capabilities of lab technicians involved in Integrated Counseling and Testing Centers (ICTCs) and Prevention of Parent to Child Transmission (PPTCT) centers across Telangana State. The inauguration of the training was attended by key officials including Smt. K Hymavathi I.AS., Project Director, Dr. P. Prasad, Additional Project Director, and Dr. Chandra Reddy, JD BSD from TGSACS.





Participants were organized into multiple batches to facilitate effective learning, with each batch consisting of 30-40 lab technicians. The training sessions were led by experienced trainers, emphasizing critical procedures and protocols essential for Early Infant Diagnosis. Special focus was placed on the timely and accurate testing for infants born to HIV-positive mothers, stressing the importance of early detection and intervention for improved health outcomes.

Upon completion of the training, participants gained essential skills and knowledge necessary for the effective implementation of EID within ICTCs and PPTCT centers. They departed equipped to apply their enhanced capabilities in their daily practices, thereby strengthening healthcare provisions and contributing to the reduction of HIV transmission among infants across Telangana State

Index Testing Campaign and SOCH for ICTC/PPTCT Counselors OF TGSACS

The objective of the training was to enhance the skills and knowledge of counselors involved in Integrated Counseling and Testing Centers (ICTCs) and Prevention of Parent to Child Transmission (PPTCT) centers across Telangana State.



Participants: A total of 163 counselors participated in the training, organized into 2 batches.

Venue: Indian Institute of Health and Family Welfare, SR Nagar, Ameerpet.

Key Officials: The training was reviewed by key officials from TGSACS, including Smt. K Hymavathi I.AS., Project Director, Dr. P. Prasad, Additional Project Director, and Dr. Chandra Reddy, JD BSD.

raining Focus: The program focused on two main components:

· Index Testing Campaign: Identifying and testing contacts of HIV-positive individuals to prevent further transmission.

SOCH (Strengthening of Covered HIV Cases): Enhancing follow-up and care for individuals already diagnosed with HIV.

Counselors received comprehensive training on effective counseling techniques, case management strategies, and the importance of confidentiality and sensitivity in HIV/AIDS care.

By the conclusion of the training, counselors had acquired advanced skills and strategies necessary to conduct successful index testing campaigns and improve the management of covered HIV cases within ICTCs and PPTCT centers across Telangana State. This initiative is expected to significantly contribute to reducing HIV transmission rates and improving health outcomes among affected individuals.
